St Mary's floor - update

Work on the St Mary's floor project is proceeding well, with a considerable amount of excavation already achieved. Gravestones and a small number of tombs have been revealed, and these are being dealt with appropriately. The revised drawings for the proposed floor design are on display in St Peter's and All Saints' Church, and comments by church members are invited. The St Mary's Fabric Committee is recommending that the Parochial Church Council should approve them at its meeting on Wednesday 19th September. Any further views should be communicated to the vicar or churchwardens before the PCC meeting, when it is hoped that a decision can be made.

St Mary's Choir returns from holiday for Evensong at All Saints' this Sunday, followed by the Sung Eucharist on the 23rd. From then until the floor is completed, it will normally sing at the 10.30am Eucharist at All Saints' Church, Raleigh Street, on the second and fourth Sundays of the month, as well as Sunday Evensongs. Wednesday Evensongs with St Mary's Choir will be held at St Peter's, starting on 26th September.
