Julia Wallin, piano



Julia Wallin, a Finnish-born pianist, recently had the great honour to perform for world renowned Maestro Valery Gergiev, with violinist Clara-Jumi Kang.

Wallin has performed across Europe, Scandinavia, UK and US and has won prizes in several competitions, such as Wilfrid Parry and Poleeni Lied Piano Competition. During this time she has collaborated as a concerto soloist with Gramophone award-winner Sinfonia Lahti and as a chamber musician for Judith Weir, one of the most renowned British composers. Wallin works closely with several leading composers and is a committed advocate of new music; she will be giving world premieres of new music in 2017. Wallin has also taught piano at King's College, University of London, where her students have obtained places to leading conservatories.

Whilst at the Royal Academy of Music, Wallin was taught by one of the most distinguished exponents of the Moscow School of piano playing, Tatyana Sarkissova as well as Andrew West, one of the most successful chamber musicians in Europe. She has been continuing her studies with professors Christopher Elton (Royal Academy of Music) and Matti Raekallio (Juilliard).

Wallin has just recorded her debut album with multi-Grammy winner producer, Andreas Neubronner, and the album will be released later in 2017.

Julia Wallin would like to acknowledge Finland's Cultural Foundation in generously awarding a scholarship for her studies at the Royal Academy of Music.
